### Accomplishments of Christ Center Community Church Missionaries During 2009

#### Nazareth, Victor & Esther



- Ministers with New Life Church in New Delhi, India.
- The church which has several locations within the metropolitan area (National Capital Region) grew from 740 people to 1060. The small groups grew from 35 to 65.
- Started a second initiative among poorer children in Gurgaon taking our total number of children to 95.
- Conducted free monthly Medical Camps in various parts of the National Capital Region of Delhi. These were a great blessing to the local churches.
- A project started to help displaced and persecuted Christians in Orissa continued by supporting 20 children who were living in a hostel and continuing their education.

#### Nowlen, Jonathan & Robin

- Serve with the Strategic Frontiers arm of YWAM.

- Operated 2 camps in China and 1 in the USA.
- Our USA camp, for Chinese exchange students, held in May included over 50 students. All the Chinese who were not Christians made decisions for Christ during the camp.
- Organized and led over 500 volunteers and short-term missionaries to serve in the University and Kids camps held in China.



- The Kids camp ministered to many young Chinese students sent to boarding school. Incredible impact in the lives of the students was evident, as well as in the teachers and faculty of the school.
- Over 500 people participated in our University camp. The campers were from the leading universities in China. Even the officials were amazed by the obvious transformation in the students. One Chinese official publicly stated in his closing ceremony speech that, “All Chinese students should do this program.” A high rate of conversion continues in the program.
- Robin also staffed and facilitated our YWAM Discipleship Training School last year in Colorado Springs. She had a great season of effective young missionary training.
- Robin and Jonathan networked extensively in the USA and abroad to organize maximum participation and impact for China.

- Started teaching on missions and discipling young student leaders in a student missions movement at Dartmouth University.

#### Flynn, Patricia

- Serves as a church planter in Amsterdam with Great Commission Ministries.



- Transitioned the church leadership from two American pastors to one American and one Dutch pastor-in-training. Seven Europeans carried the Sunday teaching load in the interim.
- The Servant-Leadership council became a vital functioning/training part of the body.
- Celebrated three marriages of believers from within the body. Marriage is almost not existent in the local culture.
- Hosted two seminars helping folks to grow in wholeness in Christ, healthier relationships and practical ministering skills.
- Hosted their first 24/7 week of prayer—a huge growth in prayer.
- Started creative initiatives to reach local artists with songwriting workshops and art exhibits.
- Sent out and supported four missionaries serving in places such as Brussels and the Caribbean.
- Transition from small friendship-oriented small home groups to communities sharing vision and mission to reach specific subcultures in Amsterdam

(biggest accomplishment). Patricia is starting the Healing Community both inside and outside the church.

### Halasah, Afeef & Majeda



- Afeef ministers with Arabs for the Arabs (AFTA) throughout the Middle East; his home is in Amman Jordan.
- Afeef and an associate pastor worked in Yemen for nine days during the spring. Eleven church leaders, converted from Islam, sat under Afeef and Waleed's training for 36 hours in a span of two and a half days. The two met with and encouraged foreign missionaries and modeled a house church meeting. In the house church this group of Muslim converts experienced worship, teaching, and communion; the first communion for the leader and many in the meeting.
- Received \$50,000 as a result of ministry in Hong Kong, for a new church and training center. This offering is about 10% of their total need, which is a very encouraging start.
- An AFTA associate in Syria reports a revival happening there. His house church has 10 regular attendees and recently spoke to more than twenty seekers and believers in a near by village. His trained workers have planted at least three new house churches. He

also took a group of 40 believers out of the country to meet with a larger group of like ethnic folk for discipleship and worship.

- Fulfillment of a long-held vision for a highway (Isaiah 19:23-25) was advanced in May when a meeting of 120 from Israel, Egypt, Assyria and Turkey met for worship and fellowship.
- In May a baptism was held on the Jordan River where an unexpected 60 people were baptized. (They had expected 20.) Earlier in April AFTA associates baptized 19 in Sudan.
- In June Afeef conducted training meetings in Malaysia, Taiwan and Hong Kong to encourage church planting work among Middle Eastern peoples.

### Mansfield, Don & Kathryn



- Serve with Campus Crusade for Christ in the 21 independent nations of the South Pacific Islands; leading a staff of eight people (four CCC couples).
- Started the CCC ministry at the University of the South Pacific in Suva at the beginning of their academic year.
- Filmed a recruiting video in Fiji to be used in USA campuses to encourage partnering on the Fiji campus ministry.
- Refocused CCC staff in Tonga to vital campus ministry.

- Helped to teach and train at the Papua New Guinea University Easter Student Training Conference. This was extremely encouraging, although there were 60 ethnic groups present, they all spoke fluent English.
- Researched starting a CCC ministry in Vanuatu, an amazing country of 83 islands; known academically as the place where 70% of all Pacific Island political leaders emerge from the University of the South Pacific school of Law, located in the capitol, Port Vila.

### Headlee, Chuck & Patience\*

- Successful implementation of four core teaching programs in China. Over 400 teachers were involved.
- Forty teachers were in full-time language study to enhance effectiveness.
- Initiated a project to establish a teacher training center in one of the poorest provinces in China. The center will work with those teaching in elementary and secondary schools.
- Worked to initiate a project to provide educational rebuilding assistance to the area hit by last summer's earthquake. Teams would be sent to train teachers to take the place of those lost in the earthquake.

### **Petrovski, Sime and Suzana**

- Sime and Suzana serve with Campus Crusade for Christ (CCC) in Skopje Macedonia. They are raising their three teenage daughters along with ministering to over four hundred students on the university campus.



- Increased unique visitors from 10 to 200 (2000%) on the CCC student website. Of the 5660 visitors in November 161 indicated receiving Christ on the website. Many visiting the website are making contact with Sime. For example Sasho asks, "What do you think, who is Jesus, and is He alive?"
- Organized for a Professor from the Faculty of Mathematics, a former Baptist church pastor to deliver a speech on the topic "Science and the Bible." The CCC staff prepared the campus students for the presentation by several creative methods. 200 students attended the speech, which was prolonged by half an hour to meet the spiritual hunger. Some students agreed to provide the CCC staff with contact information.
- Worked for three weeks in their hometown of Shtip teaching, encouraging and fellowshiping in their former church. They also met with students with whom they shared the Gospel.

- With the beginning of the fall semester the CCC staff gave out 1400 Day Planners to college freshmen with the goal of getting student contact information.
- Organized an outreach in December to show a compelling Gospel film. The CCC staff was somewhat discouraged because there was a heavy cold rain and they thought this would keep students away. But God surprised them and the hall was filled with students. Students were moved to share their testimony.

### **Martins, Afonso & Jussara**

- Serve in church planting, evangelism and leadership development.
- In church planting (a large church) 311 were baptized, 16,000 heard the Word through mass evangelism and 800 houses were visited to share the Word.



- A new church planting school trained 7 couples and they are now ready to plant a church.
- Encouraged several pastors and leaders by praying, fasting, teaching and running strategic planning meetings on structuring the church.
- Mobilized three to take missionary training.
- Developed three projects with poor city people for computer training, soccer for kids in an area dominated by drug dealers, and crafts for women.

- Seeking a way to return to the Middle East, Southeast Asia and/or Central Asia to work among the least evangelized.

### **Lewis, Jonathan & Dawn**



- Serve as Director of the World Evangelical Alliance Leadership Institute and Dean of Center for Cross-Cultural Missionary Training
- Conducted an intense English language training class in Cordoba, Argentina in which eighteen Christian leaders participated.
- Developed a new leader for the Argentine Cross-Cultural Missionary Training Center. The new leader is mature and has years in pastoral and program training experience. An immediate result is this year's class will have great training in basic missions and church planting.
- Missions trainers from all over the cone of South America were trained from a training manual co-authored by Jonathan on a holistic training design. One student commented at the conclusion that he really knew how to design good missions curriculum.
- Dawn continues to lead a women's Bible study in their neighborhood, does translation for the local school district and has a huge part in the training at CCMT in Cordoba, Argentina.

### Gava, Omar & Stella

- Serve as the Training Network Director of COMIBAM International and Latin America Director for World Evangelical Association. Missionary Training Network. Objectives are: 1. Establish missionary training center in strategic Latin American location, including Portugal and Spain. 2. Train Latino missionary training leaders and 3. Develop and implement training programs for field missionaries.
- Training programs were started in Honduras and Guatemala to support missions agencies.
- Started three new training centers, one each in Paraguay, Argentina and Peru.
- Published a third Spanish translation of books written in English. The third "Understanding Folk Religion" is about animism. The fourth published book, in Spanish, (Omar is co-author) "Cross-Cultural Training Manual" is a practical guide for missionary training programs.



- Omar is co-author of a fifth book written in collaboration with professors of the Chicago Trinity University. The subject is presentation of the gospel in church planting among indigenous peoples.

### Babcock, Randy & Jan



- Lead the CSU campus ministry for International Students Inc., evangelizing students from around the world.
- Randy suffered a bout with colon cancer, having surgery in January and started chemotherapy in March ending in October. All succeeding tests were negative for the presents of cancer.
- Continued conversational English classes on Monday and Tuesday evenings. Jan continued her English class for women at lunch on Wednesdays.
- A third conversational English class was started on Wednesday evenings.
- More Muslim students became involved in the English classes, including 2 Iraqis and 1 Libyan.
- Nineteen Chinese attended the ISI Black Hills Chinese Retreat with a Chinese student, who had become a Christian a year prior, helping to organize transportation.
- Continued the First Friday International Dinners, ISF, International Student Fellowship a Friday night Bible study and fellowship. Three Muslim students took part in ISF.
- Two Chinese from the conversational English classes became Christians. One visiting Chinese scholar who was in English class and ISF became a Christian after watching the Jesus video.
- During the summer a Chinese who decided for Christ in October 2008 was baptized in the Poudre River.

- CCCC hosted their first "Share-A-Dish" dinner in November.

### Rode, Ellen



- Serves with Youth with a Mission (YWAM) in Colorado Springs.
- Became the Director of the Teacher Resource Center a ministry connecting teachers with schools in need of teachers.
- The Center also facilitates a Teaching and Ministry Development Seminar (TMDS), a six-week course to equip staff for YWAM training locations around the world.
- Trained YWAM staff in Salem, Oregon teaching methods to be used in training schools around the world. Eight students attended and several have been sent to India.
- Further developed TMDS curriculum for future classes.
